

**Greetings:** What a busy week – the Bible Study has been launched – so well and smoothly by our dedicated team under the leadership of Sergio. As I write we are preparing for the CEO Eastern Region Mass for teachers with Cardinal Pell presiding – always a wonderful occasion when new teachers are inducted. After the Mass we priests have dinner with the SMM and OLSH School staffs. Fr Joshua is celebrant at the opening Mass for Marcellin on Friday morning. The Ventnor upgrade/painting is progressing well with carpet soon to be laid – thanks Juan and Friends of Ventnor; Young Adults are into business again; SMM school refurb is on the boil and the OLSH School Hall is a little behind schedule but looking very good indeed. We had the first meeting with music group/choir leaders talking about the musical settings for the New Mass Texts and will follow up with preparations for the choir for the Easter Triduum; liturgy group is to meet soon, and a final group for the PPC and SMM management Committees to be announced after further consultations... and February is nearly over!

**New Mass Texts: The booklets with the complete changes in responses and Eucharistic Prayers will be available hopefully next week end (\$2.50).**

Last week we looked at the response: “And with your Spirit”, which replaces “And with you”. This week we will look at the “**Penitential Act**” and the **Gloria**.

While the changes are minimal, they are decidedly ‘heavier’ in import in what is often referred to by the Latin title as the *Confiteor*: “I confess...that I have **greatly** sinned...**through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault...**” This translates more closely the Latin text (one of the foundational principles of the New Translation) “*mea culpa, mea culpa, mea maxima culpa...*” It’s strange how often I hear those words “mea culpa” especially when a public figure is making an apology for something or other – i.e. they have to some extent become part of our wider vocabulary. How do these changes, so far, “sound” to you? Many complain that it is stilted language – and wonder why it must so closely follow the Latin text rather than fit more with our everyday usages? I find it somewhat ‘heavy’ in its repetition and the use of the superlative “Most grievous fault”.

The **Lord have mercy** (Kryie eleison - a last vestige of the Mass in Greek) is not changed.

**The Gloria:** The changes are minimal: “Glory to God in the highest, **and on earth peace to people of good will.**” (Note the inclusive language). This reflects more closely the scriptural text (one of the underlying principles of the new translation) of the angels’ song of praise to the shepherds found in Luke: 2:14.

A minor change in order of the words follows, with Jesus addressed as “**Only Begotten Son**” whereas the present text refers to him as “only Son of the Father”. Then there are minor changes in word order which I think will make it very difficult to easily adapt existing musical settings and will require the purchase of new Mass settings which we are undertaking.

By far the greatest differences in the New Translations are to be found in what the celebrant’s pray in the Prayers, Prefaces and Eucharistic Prayers. These translations are of the new Latin edition of the Missal prepared by the Vatican Congregation of Divine Worship. It will take some time to ‘tune’ our ears and hearts to the new.

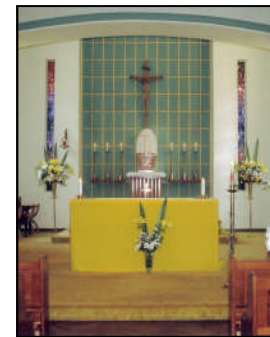
